



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INTRODUCTION

The Interface Councils *Growing Suburbs Fund Progress Report Volume Six* provides an overview of what the Growing Suburbs Fund (GSF) has achieved for outer suburban communities in the five years it has been running. The GSF is a successful initiative that has helped to deliver 82 critical community infrastructure projects so far to meet the demands of the unique and rapidly growing communities in Melbourne's Interface Councils Region (ICR).

The Interface Councils group is encouraged by the funding provided to date but is also increasingly concerned about the capacity to deliver timely essential community facilities to support healthy, connected and liveable communities in the region. The origin of this concern is evident in the persistent oversubscription of priority projects to the program's funding rounds.

For the GSF to remain an effective tool for building essential community infrastructure, an urgent reinstatement of \$55 million per annum commitment is needed, as well as a commitment to appropriate forward estimates. This would allow for CPI indexing in order to adequately address the significant gaps in essential community facilities in Melbourne's outer suburban communities.

The GSF has proven to be a vehicle for providing timely essential support for four primary areas of social disadvantage in the ICR: at risk youth, fragile families, poor health outcomes and isolated ageing. For example, those who may be at risk of or experiencing family violence are often identified through the support networks that exist within community hubs or sporting clubs.

In addition to the social benefits, more than 3990 jobs have been created, which is important in a region where a good mix of local jobs is scarce and unemployment is the highest in Victoria. This demonstrates the positive economic impact the GSF has on Melbourne's outer suburban communities.

Dedicated funding support for community infrastructure through the GSF plays an important role in strengthening the social fabric of outer suburban communities. Yet the GSF is not just about the infrastructure that is delivered. Ultimately, it's about people. It's about the social strength these projects foster. Community infrastructure is, in many ways, the glue that holds communities together. The physical assets, spaces, services, programs and activities provided and enabled by the GSF create greater social cohesion, healthy and active lifestyles and access to support services.





Looking to the future

Further, a commitment to provide funding certainty over a four-year period rather than by annual allocation would provide a valuable level of certainty for Interface Councils. This would mean Councils would be able to incorporate known funding support into Strategic Resource Plans and adequate co-contributions could be made and proper planning may be undertaken to ensure projects would be delivered in a timely way.

The group also believes active sporting facilities should be reinstated in project eligibility criteria. While the group acknowledges there is a significant amount of open space in the region, support is required to ensure there are adequate facilities and sports grounds to meet current overdemand. This is driven by increasing participation in the Australian Football League (AFL), soccer and basketball (among other sports), particularly in terms of women's participation.

In addition, there is an increasing demand for the design of change/locker room facilities to be adaptable so they may be used for wider community purposes, including female sporting teams.
